Park Manager's Report

- Josh Payette will be the new Park Director II for the Thousand Islands region. His last work week will be
 the first week of June. He will be very much missed by both the park and the Friends group. There is no
 current timeframe on hiring his replacement.
- We have a new concessionaire. They will open Memorial Day weekend at the Camp Store and the Snack Bar around the 3rd week of June. They have already stored 60 bundles that the Friends have bundled. The Friends group will receive \$3/bundle. We won't be selling wood in the Park office once the store is open. If we can't provide enough wood then they have the option to use a second source.
- May 24th Sustainability Day. If anyone wants to help the park, contact Chris Ashmoore in the Park Office.
- Free Fishing Day June 27th, will probably be held at the pond. They will provide a flyer to be handed out at Wheelfest. They also won't have to pay admission.

Firewood - Dale Jennejahn

- The wood splitter is repaired and up and running. (Note: Since then it broke and was fixed again).
- Tuesdays and Fridays at 10:00 are the current times to work on the wood bundling.
- Jay will give Dale some volunteer forms in case there are new volunteers
- Jay will try to get a trailer that we can put the bundles on to save time.
- We will get a monthly check from the concessionaire for bundles sold.

CCC/POW Site - Ed Evans

- The screen door on the house is busted if anyone wants to fix it.
- Ed has done research on the same building that appears in 3 different locations: CCC camp, outside the POW camp, and in another part of the camp at a different time. He discovered the "Cabinet Shop" was built as a portable building, thus moved to various locations. He has written up explanations in a document that can be used when giving tours or presentations.
- Through Bunnie's contacts, a SUNY Brockport historian has provided pictures of buildings from the CCC camp that were moved to Brockport College. Some were used for returning veterans attending the college.
- Nick is working on getting the rest of the posts installed, then they will be numbered.
- Grass mowing has become a struggle to keep up with.
- The Eagle Scout project is on track.
- Ed has spent over \$900 this year of his own money as a donation to the Friends of Hamlin Beach State Park. Nick and Dan also donate unknown amounts of monies by purchasing items to assist the work in the camp.
- Ed gave a talk to 30 participants at the Brighton Legacy.
- Ed's upcoming presentations:

 - July 10th at the Orleans County Historical Society in Albion, 6:30.
